We are pleased to welcome you to the launch of a landmark BES report offering the first comprehensive assessment of the potential of nature-based solutions in the UK.

The BES report is the first to offer a complete assessment of the potential of nature-based solutions in the UK. Led by world-class independent scientists and incorporating contributions from over 100 experts, it explains how nature-based solutions can be implemented to and adapt to climate change and benefit biodiversity. Importantly, it addresses their limitations and the inevitable trade-offs involved.

The event is hosted by Rt Hon Philip Dunne MP, Chair of the Environment Audit Committee of the House of Commons, and presented by Tom Heap, broadcaster and journalist, who created and presents BBC Radio's flagship climate change podcast '*39 Ways to Save the Planet*' and is a regular on BBC *Countryfile* and *Costing the Earth*.

Lead authors will take you through the recommendations of the report and answer your questions.

JOINING VIA ZOOM


If you have registered to join the event via Zoom, you will receive a link to join via email the week and day before the event.

Joining via Zoom provides you with an opportunity to ask lead authors of the report live questions on the day.

Although you can use a browser version of Zoom we strongly recommend downloading the desktop app. The desktop app is easy and free to download, and you can get it on the [Zoom website](#).

During the event, your camera and microphones will be turned off and you will not be able to turn them on or use the chat function.

Once you enter the event, you can change your view of the presenters. Click on the **View** icon in the top right of the screen, which will either be set as **Gallery View** or **Speaker View**. When you click it, it changes to the alternative option. Play around and see which one you prefer but note that these options will only become available when someone has their camera on.





JOINING VIA ZOOM

You can ask questions via the **Q&A box** at the bottom of your screen. When you click this, you will get a pop-up where you can type your question and choose to send it anonymously or not.

We encourage you to ask questions throughout the event, rather than waiting until the end of the talks. It will be a group Q&A session, so for clarity, please state the speaker you would like to direct your question to.

As questions come in you can use the thumbs up icon to up-vote questions you would like to see asked. The Chair will select questions from those submitted, which they will ask the speakers.
